



New England Clinicians Forum Cornell Scott Award

Established in 2009 in honor of Cornell Scott, this award recognizes his outstanding contributions to the community health center movement. Mr. Scott served as Executive Director of Hill Health Center from 1972 – 2008. His 40-year tenure at Hill Health Center was marked by the development of services, sites and programs aimed at the low-income population of the New Haven area. Mr. Scott earned a national reputation through his work with the National Association of Community Health Centers (NACHC). He was president of the NACHC in the 1980s when the health center program faced elimination by the U.S. Congress. Mr. Scott was a founder and first president of the Community Health Center Association of Connecticut, as well as founder and Chairman of the Board of Directors of Community Health Network of Connecticut. The Cornell Scott Award is presented to individuals for exceptional primary health care management and service to the underserved population in New England in a non-clinical capacity.

The New England Clinicians Forum (NECF) supports interdisciplinary health care team members in the delivery of accessible, high quality, community-based health care to all populations with special emphasis on the underserved.
